1. Welcome/Introductions

3. Approval of minutes: March 16, 2016 Conference Call
Moved (Tomar) and seconded (Miller) to approve minutes. Approved.
4. Leadership Council and Oral Health Florida Conference Updates (Miller)
Miller reported:
 - Call for nominations for Leadership Council positions will be going out within the next week.
 - **Oral Health Florida Conference, June 27-29 Florida Hotel Conference Center; Florida Mall, Orlando**
 - Held in conjunction with statewide Florida Public Health Association Conference
 - Lilli Copp will have a HeadStart managers meeting on Thursday morning

 - Friday sessions will bring back spotlight on best practices.
 - At Leadership Council meeting, will be voting on Chair and Vice Chair.
5. OHF DAT Data Reporting Updates
 - A. CMS EPSDT Dental and Oral Health Service Utilization Data (Herndon; see attachment)
Herndon reported that the CMS EPSDT data reports were updated to include FFY 2015. Scorecard indicators have been updated accordingly and all reports are on OHF Data page. Trends noted:
 - General increase in utilization
 - Oral health services have largest impact on children <5 years, especially 1-2 year olds; greater increase than among “dental” services.
 - B. ED Data (Tomar; see attachment and <http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/doi/10.1111/jphd.12158/full>)
Tomar reported that the dental-related ED data has been significantly expanded to include both state and county visits and charges as well as breakouts by age and payer. Key findings for CY 2014:
 - 163,906 dental related ED visits with total charges in excess of \$234 million; mainly palliative care
 - Findings are largely consistent across counties – primary payer is typically Medicaid (using state dollars to provide definitive care); followed by self-pay (uninsured)
 - Recently received 2015 data and will be updating reports

- Related paper is in press with JPHD – trend data for 2005-2014 for Florida – find increase in visits even after age-adjusting the rates. Problem is driven largely by young adults (25-45).
- Most visits occur during what would be considered normal business hours – 8 a.m. – 7 p.m. (70-80%) and not by people coming in at odd hours.

- Adding two new modules to data reporting systems
